### Sculthorpe Requiem

ADELAIDE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA CONDUCTED BY RICHARD MILLS AND THE PITJANTJATJARA CHOIR

In 1945 Peter Sculthorpe's work received its first radio broadcast. He was 16. Today he is to Australian music what Nolan and Whiteley are to our art. He is simply our best-known and best-loved composer.

For the Festival he is writing Requiem, a major work for orchestra, chorus and didjeridu. At 45 minutes, it is his longest work since Rites of Passage in 1974. Sculthorpe's love of ancient plainsong melodies spurred him to write a requiem - but with a difference. Without solo singers, it is played out by two kinds of music. The didjeridu, performed by William Barton, sings plainchant in the first, the slow sustained notes contrasting with intense drumming patterns of a percussion orchestra. The second kind of music is slower, more melodic and ethereal, with plainsong melodies sung by the full choir.

The concert opens with a performance by the Pitjantjatjara Choir and the premiere of a work by Barry Conyngham who is composing a tribute to Sculthorpe with whom he studied in the 1960s.


