WRITERS' WEEK is a unique occasion without parallel elsewhere in Australia. It is a festival within the Festival, devoted specifically to literature, to the problems and issues facing the writers themselves, and to the readers who come to listen to them.

LOCATION

The Writers' Week official location and information desk are in the Pavilion situated on the lawns at the rear of the Pioneer Women's Memorial Gardens, adjacent to the Torrens Parade Ground and opposite the Adelaide Festival Centre. The Pavilion has been made available to the Adelaide Festival by the Savings Bank of South Australia, e sponsor of Writers' Week.

PUBLIC READINGS

Readings of poetry and prose will take place on the Plaza and at various city locations each lunchtime during Writers' Week. Details of these readings will be available at the Pavilion information desk. Anyone wishing to participate in these readings should contact Helen Mills, Information Officer at the Pavilion Information Desk from Monday March 10 onwards.

BOOKSHOP

City Books is this year running the Writers' Week bookshop which will present a comprehensive stock of books by Australian and overseas writers appearing in the programme. The Bookshop will operate from a small marquee next to the pavilion and will be open during Writers' Week sessions at the Pavilion.

LUNCH AND SNACKS

The Adelaide Festival Centre Plaza across the road from the Pavilion will feature an outdoor restaurant and snack area.

BAR SERVICE

Coffee will be available from 9.30 a.m. daily and a bar will also be open during and after Writers' Week sessions at the Pavilion. These will operate from another small marquee near the Pavilion.

A limited number of tickets at \$7 each is available for the Winery Luncheon on Saturday March 8. Please apply to Josephine Landsberg, Adelaide Festival Centre, King William Road, Adelaide, and indicate if you will require transport to the luncheon.

BOOK LAUNCHES

Each day from Sunday March 9 major Australian publishers will launch books by Australian writers. Everone attending Writers' Week will be welcomed by the publishers at these launchings.
